"REMBRANDT REMASTERED' EXHIBITION 4 SEPTEMBER - 3 OCTOBER 2018, THE GREAT HALL at the ARTS CENTRE

The Arts Centre of Christchurch is very excited to let you know that we are bringing the highly regarded "Rembrandt Remastered" exhibition to Christchurch in early September.

The magnificent Great Hall will house this unique and luminous collection of 57 remastered artworks, bringing warmth and cheer to a chilly Canterbury winter.

For a month, these digitally restored and remastered works by the famous Dutch master will be available to the public to view, as well as to schools and other groups of visitors. Over 400 years after they were painted, these digital images have brought the paintings back to their original state, colour and size, and will look as they would on the day Rembrandt completed them.

Composed by Professor Ernst van de Wetering, the world's largest expert in Rembrandt, this show has been critially acclaimed around the world and generated huge interest when it was shown in the North Island. From previous exhibitions, we would estimate that over 5,000 people from Christchurch and Canterbury will attend the show over 4 weeks.

One major highlight is the enormous "The Night Watch", Rembrandt's most famous painting from 1642 which was trimmed in 1715 to fit the Amsterdam Town Hall - will be presented in its original size in Christchurch.

The Netherlands Society Christchurch is at this moment in time negotiating a sponsorship for this exhibition which should be beneficial for those members, who anticipate to visit the Great Hall during the "Rembrandt Remastered" Exhibition.

Those members who are interested to join us to visit the Exhibition will have to reply before 10 August. (ring Yoka at 384 9570)

Only a certain amount of visitors can visit this special NSC event in the Great Hall so your early interest is of great importance.




Rembrandts most famous painting was a lot bigger when completed in 1642.

I like to think they would have gone out for a Chinese dinner or for whatever their favourite food was. I'm guessing.....I'll never know.


It's those little things left undone that would make me angry if I knew my hours were limited.
