Netty, we hope you won't have to wait much longer for your operation after recently having it cancelled at the last minute.


Easter has been and gone and I am sure everyone enjoyed their big Easter Bunny, thank you, Lillian, good shopping.

ANNE FRANK'S STORY NOW ALSO TRANSLATED IN TE REO (MAORI)

Boyd Klap, who arrived in New Zealand from the Netherlands in the 1950's, now 92 years old, has been involved most of his life in raising money for worthy causes.

Boyd is the chairman of the Anne Frank Travelling Exhibition and during a visit to Parihaka, a village which in the 1870's became the centre of a non-violent campaign against European occupation, a woman asked Boyd if the book had ever been translated in te reo.

This question remained on his mind so he contacted the Anne Frank Estate in Switzerland. The reply was that, no, although translated in more than 70 languages, it had never been translated in te reo Maori.

Now Boyd 'had the bit between his teeth' He reckoned that \$100,000 would see the project completed. Not an easy task but Boyd is a man who does not seem to know the word impossible.

His greatest joy was to have found the translator, Te Haumihiata Mason.

Ms Mason has had her own share of discrimination in her childhood-days when children were caned at school for speaking Maori. Therefore she felt a certain bond with Anne Frank.

NETHERLANDS LIBERATION SKIRTS: HOW POST-WAR UPCYCLING BECAME A SYMBOL OF FEMALE SOLIDARITY



“Weave the pattern of your life”

In the aftermath of World War 2, after the liberation of the Netherlands from German occupation in May 1945 and the festivities that followed, many women made special commemorative skirts, called ‘nationale feestrok’ or ‘bevrijdingsrok’ in Dutch - the latter translates as liberation skirts in English. The idea behind this festive garment came from Mies Bissevain-Van Lennep.

During the war, for her resistance activities during the occupation, Mies had been imprisoned and sent to a concentration camp. Shortly after her arrest in 1943, she was sent a scarf made of textile patches from garments of relatives and friends, which brought back special memories.

After the war, Mies was a member of a women’s group that decided to create a garment to celebrate the rebuilding of the Netherlands. For this, the liberation skirt had great symbolic value.

The commemorative skirt had to meet certain conditions - the old but colourful patches had to be sewn on to an older skirt so that the original background disappeared and a new colourful piece of clothing was created. Today, we would call it upcycling.

Those creating a skirt were to ‘weave the pattern of your life into your skirt’, as a song composed in honour of the idea.

The philosophy behind the patchwork skirts was, on one hand, that the use of the fabric remnants represented the reconstruction and renewal of the Netherlands, while on the other hand, that women could process their own war experiences during the crafts.

Wearing the skirts together would reinforce the feeling of solidarity among women. The skirts looked alike, but each one was different. The idea was that you should not be able to see differences in the social position of the wearers.

100.000 MOLECULEN OP EEN RIJTJE

(overgenomen uit het mini boekje 'HET MYSTERIE VAN NIKS')


Heb je wel eens afgevraagd waar al het hout van een loodzware metershoge boom vandaan komt? Uit de grond? Via het water dat de boom opzuigt? Zitten daar misschien de deeltjes in die later stam of tak worden? Of halen de wortels allerlei stofjes direct uit de grond? Is die houten eettafel eigenlijk van aarde? Dat lijken de meest logische verklaringen, maar het is anders.

Een boom groeit vooral uit de onzichtbare koolstof- en zuurstofatomen die om je heen in de lucht zweven. Samen vormen die atomen weer koolstofdioxide-moleculen. Je merkt weinig van al die moleculen in de lucht, maar je ademt ze voortdurend in en uit. De bladeren in de boom kunnen de kooldioxide met behulp van grondwater en licht omzetten in suikers. Die worden omgezet in hout. Dus van de lucht uit jouw longen groeit een stukje boom waar later weer een tafel of honkbalknuppel van gemaakt wordt. En uit de bladeren van die boom komt weer zuurstof vrij die jij later inademt. Dat is nog eens lego voor gevorderden....

EEN BLOKJE ZUURSTOF

Moleculen zijn zo klein dat je ze alleen met de ingewikkeldste technische hulpmiddelen kunt zien. En dat lukt alleen nog maar met de beste microscopen ter wereld. In een haar van een tiende millimeter dik passen bijvoorbeeld al 100.000 moleculen op een rijtje. Maar die moleculen komen overal om je heen voor. En in drie vormen: als gas, in vaste vorm en in vloeibare vorm. Water ken je bijvoorbeeld als gas wanneer het als waterdamp boven de pan hangt waarin je spaghetti kookt. Maar je kent water ook als dat natte spul dat uit de kraan komt en dat keiharde ijs waar je op kunt schaatsen in de winter. Het is allemaal van dezelfde moleculen gemaakt. In de koudste vorm wordt het vast, bij het warmste wordt het gas en daartussen in is het vloeibaar. Gesteente smelt bij hoge temperaturen tot lava. Wanneer het afkoelt wordt het vervolgens weer keihard. Zuurstof kennen we vooral als het onzichtbare gas dat we inademen, maar als je het heel koud maakt wordt het vloeibaar en bij extreem lage temperaturen kun je er zelfs blokjes van maken. En de hardste metalen zoals ijzer en koper kunnen ook uit gas bestaan. Als ze maar heet genoeg zijn. Supernova's, je weet wel, die ontploffende sterren, kunnen gloeiend hete gassen van zware metalen 'uitspuigen'. Een Nederlandse kunstenaar zet zelfs luchtvervuilende gassen om in steentjes die zo hard zijn dat je er een ruit mee in kan gooien. Nou fijn dan....

Aardig allemaal, maar nu weet je nog steeds niet waarom je een berg kunt verkleinen tot het formaat van een tennisbal...ja dat kun je lezen in het volgende hoofdstuk.



SCHAAPHERDER OP DE DRENTSE HEIDE: VAN 'SNOTAAPJE' TOT DERTIG JAAR ERVARING (rtvdrenthe.nl/nieuws)

Lhee - Als een stoere bink van 16 jaar begon Johan Coelingh uit Lhee als schaapherder op het Dwingelderveld. Negentig schapen zaten er toen in de kudde, tegenwoordig zijn het er bijna vijfhonderd.

Al dertig jaar loopt Coelingh over de Drentse heide. Nu met bordercollie Tess. "Zonder hond ben je natuurlijk niks. Ik heb al heel wat honden versleten in dertig jaar."

Coelingh werd geboren aan de overkant van de heide in Ruinen. Hier kwam hij per ongeluk in aanraking met het vak van schaapherder. "Als kwajongens gingen we vaak het veld in om eieren te zoeken en kattekwaad uit te halen. We kwamen daar Paul Mos tegen, die daar toen schaapherder was. We mochten wel een dagje mee."

Mee op pad.

De vriendjes van Coelingh waren er snel flauw van, maar hij vond het geweldig. "Wat ik vooral mooi vond, waren de verhalen die Mos vertelde over datgene wat hij meemaakte. Over de bloempjes en de bijtjes en noem maar op. En natuurlijk over de schapen", zegt Coelingh.

Vaak ging Coelingh mee op pad. Tot hij in 1987 zijn eigen kudde kreeg. Natuurmonumenten wilde ook een schaapskudde op het Dwingelderveld en belden de toen 16-jarige Coelingh. "Ik was toen de jongste schaapherder van Nederland. Als ik er nu aan terugdenk: Wat was ik een snotaapje."

Van negentig naar vijfhonderd

De omgeving is erg betrokken bij de schaapskudde. Zo werd er in 1987 een fietstocht gehouden om de kudde uit te breiden. Na de actie 'Fietsen op de hei, 150 schapen erbij', werd de kudde groter. En een jaar later zorgde de actie 'Fietsen voor de kooi, is ook mooi', ervoor dat er een schaapskooi bij Lhee kwam te staan.

Daar was ineens een donderklap en een inslag.

In die dertig jaar maakte Coelingh veel mee. Een gebeurtenis vergeet hij niet snel. "Augustus, tien jaar geleden. Het was op een vrijdag, dat vergeet ik nooit weer: 8 - 8 - 2008. Het regende stevig en er was veel wind. En daar was ineens een donderklap en een inslag", blikt Coelingh terug.

De bliksem sloeg vlakbij de kudde in, maar de schapen en de honden raakten niet gewond.

De schaapherder had zelf minder geluk. Hij raakte door de klap even bewusteloos. Hij wist op eigen kracht een woning te bereiken en belandde uiteindelijk in het ziekenhuis in Hoogeveen.

Schaapjes tellen

Elke avond kijkt Coelingh of alle schapen er zijn. Hij telt ze all 496. En hij heeft nog heel veel avonden te gaan. "Ik weet niet precies wanneer mijn pensioengerechtigde leeftijd is, maar ik wil hier wel tot mijn pensioen blijven."
