It's my pleasure to give some of my free time to the Dutch Club.



MEMOIR PART 2

Mrs Alida (Arda) Harpur was a member of our club until her death at the age of 101 on 22 November 2016. (You may recall an interview with her on occasion of her 100th birthday in the October 2015 issue of the DD.) Mrs Harpur was born in Apeldoorn and emigrated to the Dutch East Indies (now Indonesia) in the 1930s. Mary Fekkes and Henk Boonen came out to NZ in 1955 with so many dutch immigrants seeking a new life after the war.

They were married soon after their arrival and forged a new life with dutch friends that they made on the boat (The Waterman) and early years in Wellington. Very much maintaining their 'dutchness' throughout their lives.

After their children grew up, they became very involved in the Dutch club, being on the committee and Mary was the treasurer for 24 years. She loved playing Klaverjas and one year won the national trophy and a trip to Holland. The last few years were difficult as Mary lost her mobility and her mind to dementia. She died peacefully surrounded by family.
