THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK IN TE REO MAORI

On the 11th September the Rotorua Dutch community was invited to attend the celebration of 'The Diary of Anne Frank in Te Reo Maori'.

17 of our committee and members attended this special event at Te Puia.

In 2017 Boyd Klap, a Dutchman turned Kiwi, who moved to New Zealand in the 1950's, was visiting Parihaka to speak about bullying and discrimination, as part of an exhibition touring the country on Anne Frank's Diary. A woman in the audience asked if the book was available in Te Reo Maori. It was not, and it set Klap on a journey to obtain the rights, publisher, and funds to translate and print it. Te Haumihiata Mason who translated the book said she would really like Maori children and youth to read this book and understand what happens in war. The strife between the Germans and Jews was brought on by hatred. Anne Frank's harrowing account of World War II is confronting, open and honest. She hopes it will take young people on a journey to Anne Frank's time and open their hearts and minds to the horrors created by racism and hatred & encouraged them to not tolerate it in any form. Excerpts of the book were read in Dutch, Te Reo Maori and English by 2 young girls. The Mayor, Stevie Chadwick and Sir Tony Curtis spoke on the impact Anne Frank's Diary has had on the world since it was published and translated in more than 60 languages.

BATTLE OF ARNHEM





At the end of September it was 75 years ago that the Battle of Arnhem took place and this fact was well commemorised in Holland and also highlighted on the Dutch TV.

Rotorua was authorised to commemorate this battle on behalf of New Zealand and Dr. Reynold McPherson, in his role of retired major, was asked to organise this event.

Because this battle has taken place on Dutch soil he also invited the Dutch community in Rotorua to join in the commemoration.

Douwe Visser and Koos Brasser were asked to organise the Dutch contribution and it was decided to also invite the Dutch ambassador Mrs. Mira Woldberg.

The main Ceremony took place at the Monument in the Government Gardens on 20 September. This involved members of several military organisations plus a Dutch contribution including the Dutch Ambassador. There were several speeches held, commemorating the Battle of Arnhem and the different groups, including our ambassador, laid a wreath on behalf of the Dutch people. Those who were present thought it was a very solemn event.
