OUR CLUB and COVID-19

Whether we like it or not, COVID-19 is part of our daily life and while I hope that we will quickly see the back of it, I also fear that we will have to endure it for a wee while longer. This pandemic has bearings on our "club life" and we have seen some of its effects already; products not being available, events cancelled and closed clubrooms.

Due to the fact that the COVID-19 virus has been amongst us for more than a

year now and we are fortunate to live in a sheltered environment called New Zealand, we have slowly pushed its presence to the back of our minds until such moment as a few days ago when there were 3 new community cases after a long, long while.

Hence this note to remind us all again about the duty to ourselves and others to stay healthy.

Committee decisions, following government restrictions, on COVID-19 rules under:

 ALL LEVELS wash your hands regularly and/or use the bacteri al hand-wash that is available; respect a person's "bubble" and avoid close con tact; use a facemask if you want to; don't come to the clubrooms or visit an event when you are not feeling well. 	 LEVEL - 1 unrestricted access to clubrooms; events are organised as per usual but with fall- back scenario's for level changes; visitors to the clubrooms and events are to use "tracer app" or "sign-in sheet". 		
 LEVEL - 2 restricted access to clubrooms (no more than 50 visitors simultaneously; "small" events held in the clubrooms can be organised but with restricted visitor numbers and for members (and their guests) only. "small" events outside the clubrooms can only be organised with permission and according to the rules of the receiving venue. In both cases, the committee will decide which events will go ahead; all other events will be cancelled/postponed until a change to a lower level; compulsory use of "tracer app" or "sign-in sheet"; use social distancing in the clubrooms and avoid close contact. 			
LEVEL – 3 • clubrooms closed; • all events cancelled/postponed; • committee will communicate, between each other and	d to members, via telephone or email only.		

Please remember: it is because of quickly implementing and strictly following such rules that we can count ourselves amongst the "fortunate" countries with few casualties.

We are in this together. Respect each other's space and opinion.
