

## **News from Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom**

The epicentre of Dutch culture transplanted to New Zealand –Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom cultural centre in Foxton –featured briefly on national radio and TV recently. Thanks to Arjan van den Boon for alerting us.

On 13 October, Radio New Zealand, Mark Amery profiled Foxton among other centres in looking at recent art and heritage work in some of our smaller centres. Noting first of all De Molen, he went on to praise Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom as a wonderful model of how public space can be shared in partnership: with one side in the hands of local iwi, Ngati Raukawa, on the other side the national Dutch museum (De Oranjehof), and in the middle, like the young shoots of harakeke (flax), is the library and community centre. "It's a remarkable building, and there's some remarkable work going on in there."

And on 24 October, TVNZ's *What Now* children's programme had two 3rd-generation Dutch boys give a 3-minute introduction to elements of Dutch culture available at the Oranjehof – 18,000 km from the Netherlands.

Some basic comparisons between New Zealand (28 million sheep and the people are 'Kiwis') and the Netherlands (23 million bicycles and the people are 'Dutch'). Also featured were wooden clogs for water protection ('It rains a lot in the Netherlands, unlike New Zealand – not!'), what Dutch children may enjoy for breakfast - muisjes, hagelslag; a sjoelbak demonstration, and of course – De Molen, the fully operational Dutch windmill grinding flour on the Manawatu plains.

#### How to register your vaccination in the Netherlands

When you have been fully vaccinated in New Zealand and are travelling to the Netherlands, you will have to request a letter from the Ministry of Health in New Zealand to be able to register your vaccination in the Netherlands. www.health.govt.nz/our-work/diseases-and-conditions/ covid-19-novel-coronavirus/covid-19-requesting-proofvaccination.

If you need proof of vaccination before the end of November, you can request a letter from the Ministry of Health which confirms your vaccination status, this takes up to 10 working days. From the end of November, you will be able to download digital vaccination and COVID-19 test certificates for us in NZ and overseas.

With the letter or certificate you can register in The Netherlands and receive a 'coronabewijs'. You can upload this 'coronabewijs' in the CoronaCheck-app. You can then use the CoronaCheck-app to access certain places and travel to different countries.






These two pics were taken in December 2019, about the time coronavirus was brewing in China.
