This year our Koningsdag celebration is going to look a little bit different.

First change is that this year we will be celebrating it on a **Saturday**, **namely 30 April**. Secondly, we will start a bit earlier, namely at 10am, and lastly it will be cojoined with the "Orange Bike" event for the Hutt Valley as part of Dutch Week. (See sidebar to right).

The gates of Avalon House will be open from **10.30am**. # Across the Strait - to the South Island

A few people have shown interest in joining the trip to the South Island or, to be more specific, to the Nelson area. After a few iterations the trip has taken on shape and some modifications. **Please advise by Sunday 10 April if you wish to join.** 

The most important change is that we are likely to travel by air. Reasons for this are: a shorter overall travel time, shorter travel distance in the South Island and the fact that the price is more or less the same (when travelling light, it is even cheaper).

Currently the plan for the trip is as follows:

### 11 May

Morning: travel from Wellington to Nelson Early afternoon: Check-in at motel in Nelson

Afternoon: free to explore Nelson Evening: joined dinner in Nelson.

### 12 May

Transport from Nelson to Moutere
Morning: Visit to 'Go Snacks'
Afternoon: Activity to be decided
Joint dinner in the oldest Pub in New Zealand
(Moutere Inn)
Transport back to motel in Nelson.

### 13 May

Morning: Free to explore Nelson

Afternoon: travel from Nelson to Wellington. As for the budget, participants need to allow the following cost per person:

Airfare: \$100 (seat only) or \$140 (seat and 23Kg bag) for a return flight (prices at the time of writing, subject to change);

Motel: Estimated \$300 per room for 2 nights; Meals: Breakfast, lunch and dinner estimated at \$200 for both days.

Pieter Koedijk has kindly offered to be our chauffeur for the trip and up to 10 people can be driven around in his mini-bus. This also means that we would like to limit the number of participants to 10.

Currently six people have shown interest in the trip. When final numbers are known, we will do our best to keep cost as low as possible, however airfares depend on availability and price changes when getting closer to the departure date. That is why those who will be joining need to confirm participation before Sunday 10 April.

The Dutch Club's Koningsdag celebration and Orange Bike Hub, and Dutch Day at Stokes Valley (below) are just some of various Dutch events being held around Aotearoa for the second annual Dutch Week. News below is from the Dutch Week organising committee.

Dutch Week 2022 is set to cast an even brighter orange glow across Aotearoa New Zealand than 2021. Activities across the country will engage in 'all things Dutch', from Saturday 23 April to Sunday 1 May – including a speech competition for young students, a film festival and traditional games for kids.

Dutch Week aims to enhance the visibility of local Dutch communities, and the contributions they make to a diverse Aotearoa. It lets people share in the strong connections between the Netherlands and New Zealand.

Under the umbrella of Dutch clubs, businesses and associations, volunteers are working together to roll out a wide range of fun activities nationwide.



"As a migrant community, we have traditionally been relatively invisible in New Zealand", says Dr Joost de Bruin, President of Dutch Communities NZ. "Dutch Week is about highlighting who we are. We invite all New Zealanders to participate in Dutch culture, try some new foods, watch a Dutch film or learn a bit of our language".

During the week, many prominent buildings around the country such as the Skytower, Michael Fowler Centre, the Christchurch Airport, the Palmerston North clock tower and others will be lit up orange – the national colour of the Netherlands, that people all over the world strongly identify with.

Support for Dutch Week across Aotearoa New Zealand is provided by the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, the Ministry for Ethnic Communities, local councils and businesses.



If you do not have all the necessary documents, your application may be delayed.
- To avoid handling of documents, please send all required documents to wel-ca@minbuza.nl before your appointment.
- Applicants are still required to bring copies of all original documents to their appointment for verification purposes.



# **National Dutch Speech & Essay Competition**

The National Dutch Speech Competition is back for its second year, but this year there is a new essay division. The topic of the essay is "Wat kan Nederland leren van Nieuw-Zeeland?" and open to all Year 9-13 students enrolled in a New Zealand secondary school. The word limit is 750 to 850 words and must be submitted by 15 April, in Dutch. (The New Zealand covid response should not be discussed in the essay to ensure that there is a good variety of answers to the question.)

The speech competition has two divisions, for year 9-11 the time limit is 2-3 minutes and for year 12&13 it is 3-4 minutes. Pre-entries for this are due on **25 April** and the participants must be available to deliver their speech live on the evening of the 29th of April during Dutch week (as well as answer a few questions from the judges). A unique aspect of our speech competition is that participants can speak in English or Dutch, so it is not just for native speakers but also for those with Dutch heritage. The topic this year is "My clogs and my jandals".
