- Make a personal checklist (www.netherlandsworldwide.nl/countries/new-zealand/living-and-working/applying-for-a-passport-or-id-card-when-you-live-abroad) per person to see which documents you will need to provide with your application. If you do not have all the necessary documents, your application may be delayed.
- To avoid handling of documents, please send all required documents to wel-ca@minbuza.nl before your appointment.
- Applicants are still required to bring copies of all original documents to their appointment for verification purposes.
