Meeting Dutch New Zealanders

Introducing Guido Loeffler, he is part of the Innate Furniture Company.



When and where were you born?

I was born in 1990 in Nairobi, Kenya. My parents were working in Tanzania at the time, but we moved back to The Netherlands when I was only a few months old. I lived there until I was 10.



What was your parents' job in Nederland, and do you have siblings? What was/is your parents' job in NZ?

My father, Scott, was a vet in Utrecht, and my mother worked for De Ministerie Van Buitenlandse Zaken in Den Haag. I have one sister, Hanna, who is three years older than me.

When did you land in NZ, boat or plane, and why, what was the motivation?

We moved to New Zealand in 2000 when I was 10 and my sister was 13. My parents were motivated by the slower pace of life, the natural environment, the weather, and the lower population density.

Any grandparents, aunties and uncles? Where are they? Have you stayed in touch with your cousins?

At the time of our move, both of my grandparents were still alive in Geleen. I still have aunts and uncles in the Netherlands and keep in touch with my cousins. A few of them have visited New Zealand, some numerous times. I'm very fond of them and look forward to visiting them again soon. I used to visit often but that has been on hold since starting my business.

What did you study and what is your job? How did you fall into that?

I studied Commerce at Canterbury University with a double endorsement in International Business and Entrepreneurship. I wanted to work within the capitalist system to make positive change. I considered politics and other avenues but ultimately decided that business drives our world and wanted to help businesses see that profitability and social good do not need to be mutually exclusive. That belief has only strengthened in the 16 years since I started studying.

Do you have kids or plan to? Will they be speaking Dutch?

I don't have kids yet, as starting a business is much like having children! I do plan on having kids in the future and will teach them Dutch from a young age and encourage them to stay multilingual.

First bike, when did you get that and how did you learn? Do you cycle in Christchurch?

I was three years old when I got my first bike, and I remember biking around Gouda as a kid very fondly. I loved it, and I still do. I'm very glad that Christchurch has a big uptake in cycling, and I can see it becoming much more normalised over the coming years. The silver lining from the earthquakes is that I think they helped speed up the transition to a cycle-friendly city.

How is your Dutch, and do you use it, and with whom?

I'm fluent in Dutch and glad to be so. I use it most days with my parents who live here, as well as often with my sister who now lives in America, and with other family members. I also listen to Dutch radio, podcasts, music, and sometimes TV. I think it's a wonderful language that has a certain art to it.
